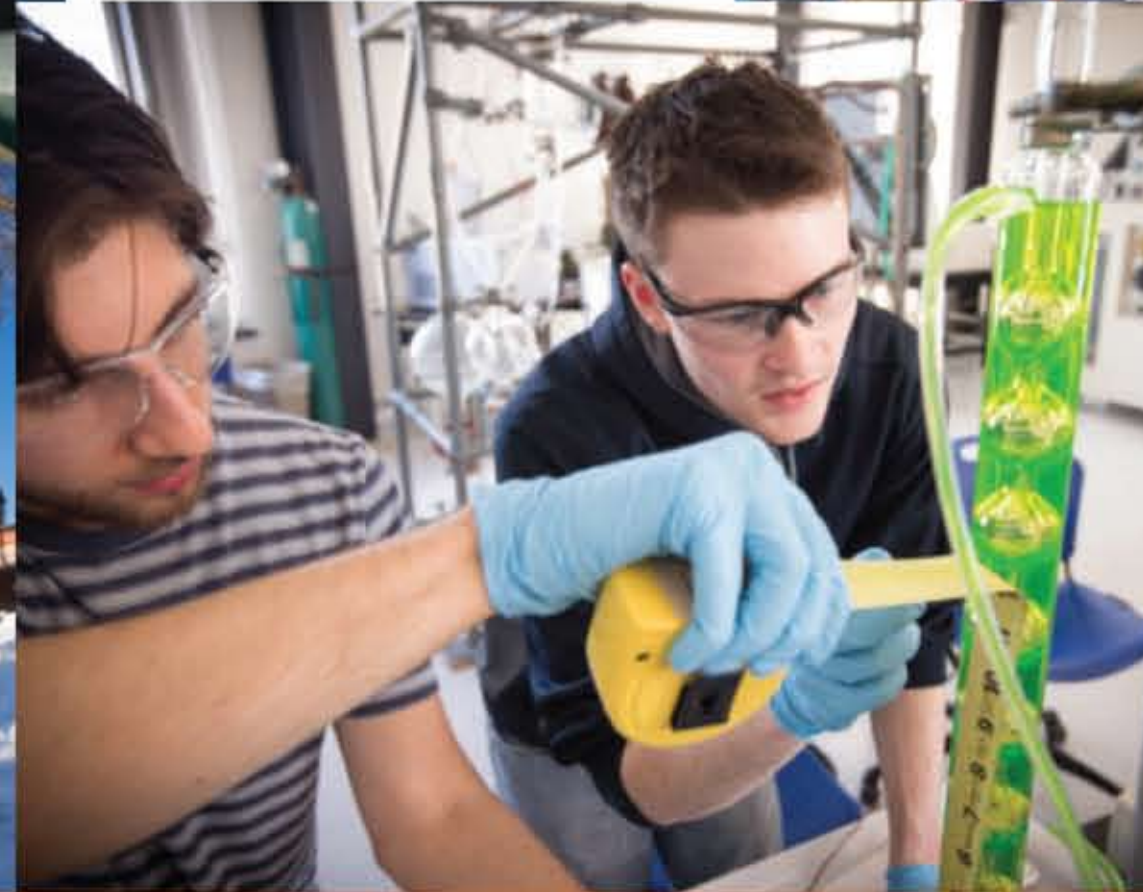

To apply for financial aid, submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by March 1, the priority deadline for all students at UNH. financialaid.unh.edu

Apply

Most successful candidates for admission to UNH demonstrate:

- Consistent grades of B+ or higher
- Four years of English and math
- Three years of lab science, social sciences, and foreign language
- Scores between 500-600 on each section of the SAT or 24 on the ACT
